6:40 COUNTY REPORTS

Representative Patrice Arent: Legislative session has just finished: police fee bill won't go in to affect for a while, but no more fee once it does. **GRAMMA bill has been voted on twice.**

Salt Lake County Councilwoman Jani Iwamoto: County council passed resolution to save route 223.

This route has the least boarding a day, according to the UTA. There is a confirmed measles outbreak from a student at Olympus High. Churchill is doing a fun run to raise money for a community garden. Animal services is looking at Calgary model for enforcement and keeping rates down through new Cat licensing. Cat rabbi's has been prevalent etc... so they are looking at this new model to help with things. 39th south will have input every 4 years.

UFA Battalion Chief Steve Judkins : change: ladder truck is on 33rd instead of 39th

UPD Detective Lutz North: Reports that there are increases in car burglaries . 2 individuals arrested for graffiti. 2 days ago there was another graffiti incident and they were able to apprehend two other individuals. In 2 weeks the safety fair will be on the 30th.

County Eastside Rep. Rita Lund: Reports on Front yard parking ordinance. Millcreek and Mount Olympus councils have asked for another month to review. It's going to be complaint based, there isn't the work force to enforce this ordinance otherwise. Please List questions about ordinance. Wednesday at 4:00, discussion will take place about the ordinance at the county. There is a Discussion about a possible sign ordinance as well.

Resident: Marilyn & Jeff Johnson 3561 S 2500 S, 801-272-5760: Sidewalk between 23 east between Neff's Lane. Worried about the proposal of a sidewalk on south side of Neff's Lane. Jani will work on this.

Al Hanes: 2501 E Neffs Lane, voiced his concern about possible sidewalks on Neff's too, he feels it would destroy the charm. He suggests speed bumps, rather than sidewalks, or stop signs.

Jessie Keller, 3315 E Delmar drive. She announces that Upland Terrace Community council is against enhanced bus route on 39th South.

Brian Strong: 3734 Green Briar Way has concerns about 39th south bus route as well. Brian is also upset that our council did not support the citizen's committee version of the Best practices and asks for us to reconsider. Our council asked what in particular he didn't like, and he was unable to show us specifically what he was concerned about, other than he didn't want the words 'enhanced bus route' relating to 39th south. After much review of the Best Practices, no verbiage containing 'enhance bus route' is found in the document.

- Riparian Corridor along Millcreek (flood control 2000 to 2300 E and grate on 23rd)
- Traffic calming along 27th East (33rd S to Evergreen) –citizens signatures submitted to County
- Honeycut from Siggard to 3900 S traffic calming, Sidewalks, Honeycut Rd (1850 E) from Siggard Dr (3650 S) to Millbrook Rd (3540 S) along the eastside of Honeycut Rd
- S-curve, sidewalk (missing section)
- Sidewalk on 2700 E 3535 S to 3900 S
